DO YOU WANT TO FOCUS ON JESUS?

You just found a great resource to have on hand!

Use it for your own personal Bible study, in a disciple-making relationship or as a reference tool for when questions arise about Jesus' chronological life on Earth.

WHAT IS IT EXACTLY?

This is the outline of a greater work called: **The Harmony of the Gospels** by Thomas and Gundry (1988). You will find a short title for **all of the Gospel scenes**. They are listed in the order of occurrence - like **on a timeline**, as opposed to the written order. To the right of each description, you can find which author(s) - **Matthew**, **Mark**, **Luke** and/ or **John** - tells the story and where.

HOW DO WE KNOW THE ORDER?

The Gospels hint at the chronology of Jesus' life through **markers like the Jewish Feasts, John the Baptist's life and death, and agricultural seasons**. Scenes often include details about **geography**, **numbers**, and **names** that help determine whether passages are parallel (the same event told from a different vantage point) or original ones.

HOW DO I USE THE OUTLINE?

- Think about each scene as **an episode** of a TV series about the life of Jesus on Earth.
- Take time to look closely at the **details of the story.**
- Listen.
- Observe.
- Ask questions of the text.
- Research cultural hints. What is Jesus feeling? What is Jesus doing? Who is He with? How is He moving?



• **Print out a map** of ancient Israel and mark the trail from episode to episode. What do you see? What do you wonder? Remember to pay attention to the order of the scenes. escenas.

You'll notice that the episodes of Jesus' life are grouped into phrases that can be seen as **5 seasons**, also like a TV series. What's different about each phase? What is the Father doing in and through Jesus? What is Jesus doing with His disciples? What about the timing seems purposeful?

WHY SHOULD I STUDY THE GOSPELS THIS WAY?

Just like our **life plays out on a timeline**, so did Jesus' life. There were things He did first and other things He waited to do. There were things He said right away and things He waited to say.

When we omit the section headings added by Bible publishers and lift the stories told by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John off the pages to **put them in order as they were lived, an unexpected, radical strategy is revealed**.
